#### #56 FORUM POST ON HOW GOD USES SATAN

THREAD TITLE: Is Satan doing exactly what God intended him to do?

I say "true". Satan is doing the "salting".

Mark 9:49 For everyone will be salted with fire.

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Dear P\_\_\_\_,

God's "will" rules supreme in this creation.

### 1Cor 8:6 But to us there is but one God, the Father, <u>of whom are all things</u>, and we in him; and one Lord Jesus Christ, <u>by whom are all things</u>, and we by him.

Nothing happens that God does not "cause" to happen. That certainly includes all the evil in the world and the destroying work of Satan:

Isa 54:15 Behold, they shall surely <u>gather together</u>, <u>but not by me</u>: whosoever shall gather together against thee shall fall for thy sake. 16 Behold, I have created the smith that bloweth the coals in the fire, and that bringeth forth an instrument for his work; <u>and I have created the waster to destroy</u>.

Consider these two verses below which show how God uses Satan:

#### 2 Sam 24:1 And again the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, and <u>he moved</u> <u>David against them to say, Go, number Israel and Judah</u>.

So how did God move David to number Israel and Judah? God sent Satan to cause it to happen:

#### 1 Chron 21:1 And Satan stood up against Israel, and provoked David to number Israel.

Also, God clearly takes credit for all the evil that is in the world:

Isa 45:5 I am the LORD, and there is none else, there is no God beside me: I girded thee, though thou hast not known me: 6 That they may know from the rising of the sun, and from the west, that there is none beside me. I am the LORD, and there is none else. 7 I form the light, and create darkness: I make peace, <u>and create evil</u>: I the LORD do all these things.

Prov 16:4 The LORD hath made all things for himself: yea, <u>even the wicked for the day of evil</u>.

Ecc 1:13 An experience of evil God has given to the sons of humanity to humble them by it.

When Adam and Eve sinned, they did so because it was <u>planned and caused</u> by God for it to happen. God even placed Satan in the Garden of Eden to tempt Eve. God never leaves anything up to chance or to mankind's supposed "free will". God is the cause of everything that happens.

Eve was even shown to be carnally mind <u>before</u> she sinned:

# Gen 3:6 And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food (LUST OF THE FLESH), and that it was pleasant to the eyes (LUST OF THE EYES), and a tree to be desired to make one wise (PRIDE OF LIFE), she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.

It is mankind's carnal nature which causes us to sin. God made mankind that way on purpose:

Rom 8:20 <u>For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him</u> <u>who hath subjected the same in hope</u>, 21 Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. 22 For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now.

### Jer 18:4 And <u>the vessel that he made of clay was marred in the hand of the potter</u>: so he made it again another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make it.

God's "will" and plan for mankind includes mankind to have an experience of evil - not just on the receiving end of evil but also on the giving end of evil.

However, since God's overall purpose for this creation is to create new offspring for Himself, He made a pathway for mankind to travel which will lead us back to Him. To accomplish this work, God the Father sent Jesus Christ:

### 1John 4:14 And we have seen and do testify that <u>the Father sent the Son to be the Savior of</u> <u>the world</u>.

After Christ finishes His work that His Father gave Him to do, it will be testified to be true that all who died in Adam, have been made alive in Christ - no one will be left out of the glorious future God has planned for us all.

1Tim 2:3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior; 4 <u>who will have all</u> <u>men to be saved</u>, and to come unto the <u>knowledge of the truth</u>. 5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; 6 who gave himself a ransom for all, <u>to be testified in due time</u>.

I just wanted to make one other comment on what you said:

You said: I say "true". Satan is doing the "salting".

#### Mark 9:49 For everyone will be salted with fire.

"Fire" is the spiritual symbol for judgment. Everyone will be salted (seasoned) by judgment. Satan does not do the "salting" as you stated. It is Christ and the Law who does the "salting".

Consider these verses on "salt":

Lev 2:13 And every oblation of thy meat offering shalt thou season with salt; neither shalt thou suffer the salt of the covenant of thy God to be lacking from thy meat offering: with all thine offerings thou shalt offer salt.

### Eze 43:24 And thou shalt offer them before the LORD, and the priests shall cast salt upon them, and they shall offer them up *for* a burnt offering unto the LORD.

The reason "salt" is added to the meat offerings is because it foreshadows the death of Christ. His death was a requirement of the Law to satisfy the penalty of the sins of mankind:

#### John 1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, <u>Behold the Lamb of</u> <u>God, which taketh away the sin of the world</u>.

Christ was "salted" with fire (judgment) so that His death would "take away the sin of the world".

From Christ's death on the cross, Christ earned the keys to death and hell (the unseen place of the grave):

### Rev 1:18 I *am* he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.

Christ now has the legal authority to resurrect all mankind (whether we are saved or not) from the grave so that we have "life":

#### John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that

#### they might have life, and that they might have *it* more abundantly.

However, Christ came to give mankind more than just the same sinful life we presently have. He also came to give us a life that is <u>more abundant</u>. That more abundant life is a life which is free from sin and a life which has a restored relationship with His Father. Christ will accomplish mankind's <u>more abundant life</u> through His New Covenant which will convert all mankind into children of God.

1 Corinthians 3:13 each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done.

#### Dear P\_\_\_\_,

Yes, all mankind will be judged. The Elect will be judged immediately following the Marriage to the Lamb (new birth) and the Marriage Supper of the Lamb (consuming the truth of Christ). These events occur after Christ returns (His second coming) to the believer and pours out the Latter Rain upon them. Immediately after the Marriage Supper, judgment will fall on the believer's carnality. This judgment begins the "Day of the Lord" for that believer. This time of judgment for the Elect is called the "Thousand Years Reign". During this time of judgment, the new child of God will reign with Christ over their own judgment and will not experience wrath. Revelation chapter 19 and the first part of chapter 20 teach these truths.

Once the believer's judgment is complete, they will be fully converted and governed by the Holy Spirit.

For the people who are not saved before they die, they will be resurrected to judgment. During their judgment, they will experience "wrath" because they have not been "born again" when their judgment starts. Their judgment will be in accordance with the Law which demands their death. However, before they perish, Christ will have pity (mercy) upon them. He will then give them the Early and Latter Rain which will give them a new birth. Joel chapter 2 teaches this truth.

Without judgment, no one can be converted. This truth is what these two verses below are teaching:

### Mat 26:52 Then said Jesus unto him, put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword.

### Isa 66:16 For by fire and by his sword will the LORD plead with all flesh: and the slain of the LORD shall be many.

The "sword" is a symbol for the Word of God which is Christ. "Fire" is the symbol for judgment. Those who "perish" represents believers who have just been converted. It is their Man of Sin/Old Man who perishes, leaving only the newly born child of God.

Dear P\_\_\_\_,

Once a believer is fully converted, they will be solely governed by the Holy Spirit and will sin no more. Being fully converted can take many years. The initial part of conversion happens quickly. That portion of judgment destroys the spirit of anti-Christ within the believer and it also destroys their carnal spiritual nature (Mystery Babylon the Great Harlot). They are said to be destroyed in "one hour". However, to be fully converted, a life time of carnal beliefs must be destroyed as well. This judgment is commonly called the chastisement of Christ.

This verse below teaches that judgment:

# Isa 26:9 With my soul have I desired thee in the night; yea, with my spirit within me will I seek thee early: for when thy judgments are in the (new) earth, <u>the inhabitants of the world</u> <u>will learn righteousness</u>.

The "earth" is a symbol for the spiritual nature of mankind. <u>The Old Earth is our carnal nature</u> and the New Earth is the spiritual nature which the Holy Spirit gives us. In the verse above, the "earth" mentioned is the <u>New Earth</u>. It is the New Earth which teaches us righteousness and transforms our carnal mind into the Mind of Christ. Once this transformation is complete, the believer will walk by the Spirit and not by the flesh.

From what you have stated in your post, I believe you have received the Latter Rain and have been given "eyes that can see". <u>I encourage you to keep consuming the truth of God which is taught in scripture</u>. It is that truth which will continue your conversion process and mature you into a son.

I also want to point out this verse which applies to the conversion process:

# Rom 4:17 (As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations,) before him whom he believed, *even* God, <u>who quickeneth the dead</u> (the new birth), and <u>calleth those things</u> <u>which be not as though they were</u>.

Upon receiving the Latter Rain, the believer is saved. It is at this point that God calls him His child even though the full process of conversion is not yet complete (he hasn't learned righteousness yet and he still walks by the flesh and sins). Until the new born child of God fully matures into a son, the blood of Christ will cover the sins they still commit. After they have spiritually matured, they will be a fully converted son of God and will only walk by the Spirit.

Finally, I want to re-enforce something that I am sure you already know. We are the work of Christ and He is the one who will see to it that we spiritually mature into a son. Christ is the one who will defeat the "giants in the land" (strongholds of our carnal mind). All we need is the same faith that Joshua and Caleb had when they spied out the Promised Land and saw the giants dwelling there - and Christ is the one who will give us that faith. We contribute nothing towards our own salvation.

Num 13:25 And they returned from searching of the land after forty days. 26 And they went and came to Moses, and to Aaron, and to all the congregation of the children of Israel, unto the wilderness of Paran, to Kadesh; and brought back word unto them, and unto all the congregation, and shewed them the fruit of the land. 27 And they told him, and said, We came unto the land whither thou sentest us, and surely it floweth with milk and honey; and this *is* the fruit of it. 28 Nevertheless the people *be* strong that dwell in the land, and the cities *are* walled, *and* very great: and moreover we saw the children of Anak (giants) there. 29 The Amalekites dwell in the land of the south: and the Hittites, and the Jebusites, and the Amorites, dwell in the mountains: and the Canaanites dwell by the sea, and by the coast of Jordan. 30 <u>And Caleb stilled the people before Moses, and said, Let us go up at once, and possess it; for we are well able to overcome it.</u>

The Promised Land is a symbol for our salvation (a child of God). Though it may seem impossible for us to conquer the giants in the Promised Land, we must never forget that Christ is the one who will defeat them. We are the work of His hands and not our own.

I welcome you to join me in saying: "Let's go up at once and possess the Land; for we are well able to overcome it".

Rev 17:14 These (the giants) shall make war with the Lamb, and <u>the Lamb shall overcome</u> <u>them</u>: for he is Lord of lords, and King of kings: and they that are with him *are* called, and chosen, and faithful.
