God chose the followers of Christ in him before the foundation of the world. This means the sacrifice of Jesus and hence, its need – Adam's disobedience – was foreseen by God before the foundation of the world.

God caused Adam and Eve to sin by creating them <u>spiritually marred</u> (Jer 18:4) and <u>subject to vanity</u> (Rom 8:20). In this weak spiritual condition, the body of flesh that He gave them quickly started governing their spirit, causing it to have a <u>carnal nature</u>. With a carnal spiritual nature, Adam and Eve's minds quickly became carnal as well.

In this condition, Adam and Eve would sin and sin often just as all their offspring do. Christ even placed Satan (who He made to be the "destroyer" of mankind, Isa 54:15) in the Garden of Eden to tempt Eve after her mind became carnal:

Gen 3:6 And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food (LUST OF THE FLESH), and that it was pleasant to the eyes (LUST OF THE EYES), and a tree to be desired to make one wise (PRIDE OF LIFE), she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.

By tempting Eve to sin, Satan became mankind's destroyer just as God created him to be.

These scriptures also apply:

Ecc 1:13 An experience of evil God has given to the sons of humanity to humble them by it.

Ecc 7:13 Consider the work of God: for who can make that straight, which he hath made crooked?

Isa 45:7 I form the light, and create darkness: I make peace, <u>and create evil</u>: I the LORD do all these things.

Prov 16:4 The LORD hath made all things for himself: yea, even the wicked for the day of evil.

Isa 63:17 O LORD, why hast thou made us to err from thy ways, and hardened our heart from thy fear? Return for thy servants' sake, the tribes of thine inheritance.

In their spiritual carnal condition, Adam and Eve had <u>no ability to choose</u> following the law of God over the dictates of their flesh.

These verses apply:

Prov 16:1 The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the LORD.

Prov 20:24 Man's goings are of the LORD; how can a man then understand his own way?

Jer 10:23 I know, Jehovah, that the way of man is <u>not his own</u>; it is not in a man that walketh to direct his steps.

Dan 4:35 And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as <u>nothing</u>; and he doeth according to his will in the army of the heavens, and among the inhabitants of the earth; and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou?

The teaching that mankind has a free will ability to make choices is a lie from the destroyer via the spirit of anti-Christ. God is in complete control of everything that happens in this creation. Nothing happens by chance or by man's will - everything happens because God plans and causes it to happen.

So why does God do it this way?

Scripture teaches truth "here a little and there a little" (Isa 28:9-12) so we have to look elsewhere in scripture to learn the whole truth of a matter. Eve sinned because she was created spiritually marred and carnally minded. This is why Eve (and all mankind) put her desires over obeying the commandments of God. All mankind does this, too, and that is why all mankind sins.

The "potter" is Christ who is mankind's God and Creator. He is the one who spiritually marred mankind and made mankind subject to vanity. The flaw in the vessel is a spiritual flaw and is not in the body of flesh. We can know this because Christ came in the world with the same body of flesh as mankind <u>but He was spiritually perfect</u> (full measure of the Spirit) and because of such, He never sinned.

Is a 64:8 But now, O LORD, thou art our father; we are the clay, and thou our potter; and we all are the work of thy hand.

Jer 18:4 And the vessel that he made of clay was marred in the hand of the potter: so he

made it again another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make it.

Christ is now in the process of making mankind into "another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make":

Eph 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast. 10 <u>For we are his workmanship</u>, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

15 Then the LORD God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to cultivate it and keep it.

God even WARNED the man telling him that if he ate from the tree he would die.

Yes, God warned Adam and Eve to obey Him just as He warned the Nation of Israel to obey Him, too. But in both cases, it was not within their power to obey God because of the flaw in mankind's spiritual makeup. Mankind's spirit is carnal which has made the mind of mankind carnal as well. Christ certainly knew this about man and knew that man cannot follow His commandments perfectly. Mankind will always eventually sin against God and there is nothing that mankind can do about it.

Mark 16:15 has nothing to do with the Ordo Salutis.

Read Ephesians 2:8 and please explain how salvation comes before faith:

8For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, *it is* the gift of God;

THROUGH faith

we have been SAVED

by the Grace of God - God's LOVE for His creation

We are saved through faith. Through faith we are saved.

Dear G,

Salvation does not come <u>before</u> faith and I do not teach that it does. Faith in Christ is what makes Christ's pathway straight for Him to come and convert a person into the new vessel. This spiritual process is called <u>conversion</u> and is taught over and over again in scripture "here a little and there a little".

Below is the pathway to salvation that Christ will cause His Elect to travel. This pathway was established by Christ shortly after Paul's death when the spirit of anti-Christ came and devoured the church (only the unconverted believers/the babes):

When Christ decides to begin the process of salvation for a person, He will come to them without their asking and without their permission. When He comes, Christ will freely give them the <u>Early Rain of the Spirit</u>. Christ gives the person this gift because of His grace and not because of anything (works) that the person did to deserve it. And because the person is carnal, they are veiled from knowing when it happened. However, they can know that it happened later when they make a confession of faith after the Gospel is presented to them. Without the Spirit (even the small amount of the Early Rain), no man can call Jesus "Lord" and with the Spirit, they will always accept Him.

1Cor 12:3 Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God

calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Spirit.

The Early Rain of the Spirit is what Peter received prior to him recognizing that Jesus was the Christ.

Mat 16:15 He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am? 16 And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God. 17 And Jesus answered and said unto him, <u>Blessed art thou</u>, Simon Barjona: <u>for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee</u>, but my Father which is in heaven.

Christ calls Peter "blessed" because He was given the Early Rain of the Spirit which revealed who Jesus actually was. Christ then says that the only reason he could "see" this truth was because it was revealed to him by His Father. Peter had no ability of his own to know this truth about Jesus if he had not been given to Peter (via the Early Rain of the Spirit). Christ then continued and said that it is upon this rock (the foundation) that He will build His church. And since Peter's confession originated from having the Early Rain of the Spirit, so will everyone else's confession.

Since the Early Rain of the Spirit is given in "measure" (a small amount, a "seed"), it will leave the new believer <u>carnally minded</u>, <u>spiritually blind</u> and <u>unconverted</u>. This is the spiritual condition of all new "babes" in Christ. They will have a "measure of faith" but little else beyond knowing "Christ and Him crucified". It is at this point that the person will enter the church.

Next, Satan will come to the new believer and plant his seed within them, too. His seed is the spirit of anti-Christ. Now the new believer as both the Early Rain of the Spirit and the spirit of anti-Christ within themselves. This causes a spiritual war to develop over who will govern the person. Since the Early Rain of the Spirit is given in "measure" and the person is unable to understand the spiritual truths of the New Covenant, Satan has no trouble deceiving the new believer into thinking that he is Christ (an angel of Light) and that his lies are truth. Paul mentions it here:

2Cor 11:4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him.

Christ mentions it here:

Mat 12:43 When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest, and findeth none. 44 Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished. 45 Then goeth he, and taketh with himself SEVEN other spirits (represents the spirit of anti-Christ) more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is

worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation.

After the new believer is deceived, they will accept Satan's "another gospel" which mixes "works" with faith. When the believer commits this sin, they will "fall from grace" and lose their salvation. This is the "sin that leads to death" that Paul and John mentioned in their letters.

The believer will remain in this fallen away condition until they die <u>OR</u> (if they are one of the Elect) until Christ restores their faith by giving them the <u>Latter Rain of the Spirit</u>. Peter received the Latter Rain of the Spirit on the Day of Pentecost with the other 119 Jewish Elect. Judgment also fell on him and he was converted. Paul received the Latter Rain of the Spirit after being in Damascus for three days.

Besides restoring the believer's faith, the Latter Rain of the Spirit will also heal the person's spiritual blindness and cause the person to be "born again". With their blindness healed, Christ will appear and gather the new child of God to heaven (spiritually speaking). In other words, the believer is added to the Kingdom of Heaven but they will still physically dwell on the earth until they die. After this event, judgment will follow and remove the spirit of anti-Christ and the Great Harlot (represents the person's carnal nature) from within the believer. Both will be cast into the Lake of Fire for destruction. Mat 24:37-41 and Rev 19:11-21 teach this truth. After the person's judgment is complete, the believer is converted and will never fall away again. Their salvation is secured and they will receive their rewards upon their resurrection from the grave.

This is how Christ builds His church and He starts with the foundation of the confession of faith.

The translation is from the Concordant Literal Translation.

Here is the full verse:

Ecc 1:13 Ecc 1:13 I applied my heart to inquiring and exploring by wisdom all that is done under the heavens; an experience of evil (ra) God has given to the sons of humanity to humble them by it.

You asked:

So you think God makes mistakes?

Absolutely not. God made Adam and Eve spiritually marred and subject to vanity on purpose. He created them this way so that they would sin and experience evil. In this way, they would experientially learn about good and evil.

So why do you believe that Adam and Eve sinned?

The apostate church teaches that God took a chance with Adam and Eve by giving them a free will ability. With this free will ability, Adam and Eve choose to disobey God. However, this teaching has ZERO scriptural support and is contradicted by numerous scriptures. The truth is that God did not give Adam and Eve a free will ability. Only God the Father has a free will ability to do as He pleases. Everyone else's "will" is governed by God.

2Thes 2:1 Now we beseech you, brethren, by the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, and by our gathering together unto him, 2 That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by word, nor by letter as from us, as that the day of Christ is at hand. 3 Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there comes a falling away first, and that MAN OF SIN be revealed, the son of perdition; 4 Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God.

The Doctrine of Free Will taught by the apostate church is the reason that the man of sin (the worsen child of the devil) sits in God's temple (place where the Holy Spirit resides) claiming to be God. This is the Abomination of Desolation the Christ mentions in Mat 24:15.

Prov 3:5 Trust unto Jehovah with all thy heart, And unto thine own understanding lean not. 6 In all thy ways know thou Him, And He doth make straight thy paths.

After a person realizes this truth, they will be lead to Christ and the New Wine which will change us and justify us before God.

This truth is taught by Isa 28:9-12 and Mat 12:43-45.

After Paul's departing, the entire church which was made up of "babes" (Early Rain only), was completely devoured by the wolves (Acts 20:29-31). Nothing has changed since that time and it won't change because it is God's "will" for all babes to become apostate.

The teachings of Christ frequently teach about the apostasy that was soon to be coming. However, Christ teaches it in His spiritual language so that a true understanding of the apostasy will remain veiled from new believers (babes).

Consider this verse:

Mat 24:24 For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect.

The only reason that the very Elect were not deceived by Satan is because they were converted BEFORE the spirit of anti-Christ came into the world and devoured the church. A converted believer cannot be deceived by Satan.

The scripture in Isaiah teaches about the apostasy, too. You should read it again carefully and really consider the profound message that it teaches.

Isa 28:9 Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? them that are weaned from the milk, and drawn from the breasts (converted believers/little children). 10 For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little: 11 For with stammering lips and another language (spiritual language) will he speak to this people. 12 But the word of the LORD was unto them precept upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little; that they (the babes who draw milk) might go, and fall backward, and be broken, and snared, and taken (by Satan, this is when a babe becomes apostate).

The believers who are weaned from the breasts are converted believers. How do I know this? Because of what Christ says here:

Mat 18:3 And said, Verily I say unto you, <u>Except ye be converted</u>, and become as little <u>children</u>, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Only the Elect will be converted in this age. They are the First Fruits of Christ's harvest of mankind. For them, Christ will come to them TWO times.

Hos 6:3 Then shall we know, if we follow on to know the LORD: his going forth is prepared as the morning; and he (Christ) shall come unto us as the RAIN, as the latter and former RAIN unto the earth.

The first time Christ comes as the Rain is when He comes to an unbeliever and gives them the Early Rain of the Spirit. The Early Rain is what gives a person their faith in Christ. The apostles received the Early Rain of the Spirit when they walked with Christ. But because the Early Rain of the Spirit leaves a new believer (a babe) spiritually blind, they cannot understand the spiritual teachings of the New Covenant.

Consider what Christ said to the apostles below:

John 16:12 I have yet many things to say unto you, <u>but ye cannot bear them now</u> (why? because they are babes who draw milk). 13 Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth (this is the Latter Rain), is come, <u>he will guide you into all truth</u>: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, *that* shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come.

When the Spirit of Truth came to the apostles on the Day of Pentecost, they were converted and went from being spiritually blind babes to being "little children" who can be "guided into all truth".

Mat 18:3 And said, Verily I say unto you, Except ye be <u>converted</u>, and become as <u>little</u> <u>children</u>, <u>ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven</u>.

Luke 22:32 But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren.

Consider this: The apostles made a confession of faith and called Jesus "Lord" when they walked with Him. How were they able to do make this confession of faith?

There is only one way a person can make a confession of faith as this verse says:

1Cor 12:3 Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that <u>no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy</u> Spirit.

The <u>only way</u> the apostles were able to make a confession of faith was because the Father gave them the Early Rain of the Spirit.

Christ confirms this truth here:

Mat 16:17 And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: <u>for</u> flesh and blood hath not revealed *it* unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven.

With even just the small amount of the Spirit (the Early Rain), the apostles could understand (see) that Jesus was the Christ and have faith in Him. But because they only had the Early Rain of the Spirit, they were "babes" who could draw the milk of the Word. For that reason, Christ

told them in John 16:12 that He had <u>much more to tell them</u> but that they couldn't "bear" it yet.

Were the apostles saved after they made the confession of faith after having been given the Early Rain of the Spirit? No, they were not. But they did have the faith which the Early Rain of the Spirit gave them. With this faith, Christ's pathway was made <u>straight</u> for Christ to "come again" and give them the Spirit of Truth (Latter Rain) and convert them (save them).

After the apostles received the Spirit of Truth (Latter Rain) and were converted, they went from being a babe to being a little child. This is when they were saved and when they entered the Kingdom of Heaven as Mat 18:3 says.

To be saved, a person MUST be given both the Early and Latter Rains of the Spirit.

Paul understood this truth and that is why He said this:

Heb 9:28 So Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will <u>appear a second time</u>, not to bear sin, <u>but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him</u>.

After a person is given the Early Rain of the Spirit, they can understand (see) the physical work of Christ that led Him to the cross (Christ and Him crucified). In the spiritual language of Christ, this is when Christ appears/comes to a person "in the flesh":

1John 4:3 And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus <u>Christ is come in the flesh</u> is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.

If a person does not have the Early Rain of the Spirit, they cannot "see" Christ's first appearance. This is the reason why a person will remain an unbeliever.

Since "babes" are spiritually blind, they will deny that Christ ever came to them "in the flesh". They believe that He came to them like He did to the 120 Jewish Elect on the Day of Pentecost. This belief is why they deny the existence of the Early Rain of the Spirit which gave them their faith. And since they deny the Early Rain of the Spirit, they take credit for the faith that they have rather than giving credit to Christ who gave it to them with the Early Rain. This is one of the primary signs that a believer has become apostate.

Many like to forget verse 10.

James 2:14

A believer's "good works" are the evidence of their conversion. They happen because of what

Phil 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.

In other words, the good works that a converted believer does <u>are not their own works</u>, they are the works of Christ that He does through the believer.

Isa 26:12 O Jehovah, thou appointest peace to us (conversion/salvation), for, <u>all our works</u> also thou hast wrought for us (do of His good pleasure).

You asked:

The cross is the Old Covenant?

The physical work that Christ did which led Him to the cross was performed <u>under the Old Covenant</u>. This work had to be performed so that He would be the perfect and sinless sacrifice (a lamb without spot or blemish) which was required by the Law.

Because Christ's work under the Old Covenant was physical and outward, carnal believers (babes) don't have trouble understanding it. This is why Paul made these statements below to the "babes" in the Corinthian church:

1Cor 2:2 For I determined not to know anything among you, <u>save Jesus Christ, and him</u> crucified.

1Cor 3:1 And I, brethren, <u>could not speak unto you as unto spiritual</u>, <u>but as unto carnal</u>, <u>even as unto babes in Christ</u>. 2 I have fed you with milk, and <u>not with meat</u>: for hitherto ye were not able to bear it, neither yet now are ye able. 3 For ye are yet carnal: for whereas

there is among you envying, and strife, and divisions, are ye not carnal, and walk as men?

All babes in Christ are just as carnal and spiritually blind as the Corinthian believers were.

Because the Corinthians were babes who had only been given the Early Rain of the Spirit, Paul also made this statement to them:

1Cor 1:6 Even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you (Early Rain): 7 So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (second coming): 8 Who shall also confirm you unto the end (Latter Rain), that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (judgment of the believer which completes the conversion process).

The "type" taught by the story of the <u>woman taken in adultery</u> (John 8:3-11) is a second witness to when a believer comes out from being under the Law. It happens after they have received the Latter Rain of the Spirit.

In the story, the woman represents mankind and more specifically, Adam and Eve. When Adam and Eve listened to Satan over what Christ had told them, they committed spiritual adultery with Satan. This is what the woman's adultery represented. When the woman is brought to Christ to judge her, He writes in the earth. This represents Christ writing His law of the Spirit in the woman's heart. This is a type for the Early Rain of the Spirit. But after Christ writes in the earth the first time, the Pharisees do not drop their stones (a type for the Law) and leave. Christ then writes in the earth a second time. This is a type for the Latter Rain of the Spirit. After the woman receives the Latter Rain, the Pharisees drop their stones and leave because the Law can no longer accuse the woman. She is now under the blood of Christ and has become a new creation.

This is not what you said originally. In your post no. 119, you stated this:

Religion is the attempt to make oneself acceptable to God by one's own works. True Christianity is not a religion because mankind's has no works to perform under the New Covenant of Grace through Faith. All the "works" are the works of Christ, both His physical works that He performed under the Old Covenant (the cross) and His spiritual works that He is performing now within the Elect. Christ performs these works solely because of His grace and not because a person does anything to deserve it.

Christianity is not a religion because mankind has no works to perform under the NC of grace through faith.

All the works are the works of Christ.

Man has always had works to perform....as per all the verses I posted.

All the works are of Christ could mean that ONLY Christ has His work cut out for Him while we do nothing.

If you want to change the above to mean that WORKS DO NOT SAVE US WITHOUT FAITH... then I agree 100%.

Faith without works is a dead faith. Works without faith are dead works.

FaithWillDo quoted:

1Cor 1:6 Even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you (Early Rain): 7 So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (second coming): 8 Who shall also confirm you unto the end (Latter Rain), that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (judgment of the believer which completes the conversion process).

The above is referring to sanctification. Do you agree?

"Judgment of the believer completes the conversion process..." do you mean glorification?

FaithWillDo said:

In the story, the woman represents mankind and more specifically, Adam and Eve. When Adam and Eve listened to Satan over what Christ had told them, they committed spiritual adultery with Satan. This is what the woman's adultery represented. When the woman is brought to Christ to judge her, He writes in the earth. This represents Christ writing His law of the Spirit in the woman's heart. This is a type for the Early Rain of the Spirit. But after Christ writes in the earth the first time, the Pharisees do not drop their stones (a type for the Law) and leave. Christ then writes in the earth a second time. This is a type for the Latter Rain of the Spirit. After the woman receives the Latter Rain, the Pharisees drop their stones and leave because the Law can no longer accuse the woman. She is now under the blood of Christ and has become a new creation.

Wow. Very good.

Will have to read it again tomorrow when I'm more awake.

Dear G,
You said:
This is not what you said originally.

My statements do not contradict each other. God does all the works <u>in us</u> and <u>through us</u>. We repent, we have faith and we make a confession of faith, we do good works <u>BUT</u> it is the Holy Spirit within us who is the one who causes us to "will" and to "do" those things. We can take credit for none of it.

Phil 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.

Eph 1:11 In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will:

The "things" that God "worketh" include the spiritual things within mankind.

Mankind does not direct their own steps, nor does mankind have a free will ability to make their own decisions. Mankind has a "will" but it is not free.

Jer 10:23 I know, Jehovah, that the way of man is <u>not his own</u>; it is not in a man that walketh to direct his steps.

Prov 16:1 The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the LORD.

One other point on this subject. One of the primary reasons that mankind believes that they have a "free will" is because mankind cannot see, hear, taste or feel the spiritual work that God does within mankind. Mankind's carnality blinds them to it.

Ecc 3:11 He has made everything <u>fitting</u> in its season; However, He has put <u>obscurity</u> (the <u>carnality of this world</u>) <u>in their heart so that the man may NOT find out His work</u>, that which God does, that which God does from the beginning to the end.

Though one may argue over the translation of this verse, I believe the translation above conveys it's correct teaching. It is man's carnality that blinds man from sensing the spiritual work that God does within the hearts and minds of mankind. For that reason, it takes <u>faith</u> to believe that God really does direct the steps of mankind.

You said:

Ok. Maybe you could stop using the phrase BABES and start saying carnal believers - which we all understand.

The term "babes" is what scripture uses and I find that using that term usually works the best.

When I use the term "babe" it has a very specific meaning. It means believers who only have been given the Early Rain of the Spirit and who remain <u>carnally minded</u>, <u>spiritually blind</u> and <u>unconverted</u>. Because of these weakness, all babes will "fall backward, be broken, snared and taken" by Satan.

You asked:

Can a person be carnal (yet carnal - verse 3) and still be a believer?

Yes, all "babes" are carnal and they are believers. This is true because the Early Rain of the Spirit gives a babe a "measure of faith". But because the babes are spiritually blind and carnal, they <u>can and will</u> be deceived by Satan. However, this was not true for the early believers prior to the spirit of anti-Christ coming into the church. When you read the NT letters, you must keep in mind that the babes to whom the letters were written were remaining faithful to Christ (no works). They were able to remain faithful because of the work of the apostles and because the spirit of anti-Christ had not come yet. But all that quickly changed after the death of Paul and the babes in the churches (who are "many") all fall away. They retained their zeal for God but it was not based on knowledge.

Rom 10:2 For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge.

Though Paul was speaking of Israel in the verse above, it also applies to carnal believers, too, but with one difference. Carnal believers, though they are carnally minded just like Israel, they do have the Early Rain which gives them faith and the ability to see and accept the physical work of Christ that He did at the cross. Israel does not have the Early Rain and will not recognize Jesus as the Christ. But Israel still has zeal for God, its just that they cannot see who God really is. They are totally blind and have been cast into "outer darkness".

You said:

The above is referring to sanctification. Do you agree?

"Judgment of the believer completes the conversion process..." do you mean glorification?

Here's the verse again:

1Cor 1:6 Even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you (Early Rain): 7 So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (second coming): 8 Who shall also confirm you unto the end (Latter Rain), that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (judgment of the believer which completes the conversion process).

Here is my understanding: The Early Rain gives a believer "faith". Faith is what justifies a believer. However, after a babe begins mixing in their own works with the works of Christ, they will become "unfaithful" and will no longer be justified. Becoming unfaithful does not mean that they no longer believe in Christ because they still do. They are just are not approaching Christ solely by faith any longer since they are mixing in their own works.

For example: When Israel sent the 12 spies into the Promised Land (represents salvation), 10 of the spies came back with a "bad report" because they didn't believe that they could defeat the giants in the land (represents strongholds of man's carnality). This is a bad report because the 10 spies did not have faith that God would defeat the giants for them (or through them). This is what it means to be unfaithful. The 10 spies were mixing in their own works and faith. The 2 spies (Joshua and Caleb/types for the Elect) that came back with a good report believed that God would defeat the giants. They were ready to cross into the promised and it was based on faith. But since the congregation believed the bad report, God caused the nation to wander in the wilderness for 40 years. This is a type for the church becoming apostate. The number 40 represents a time of tribulation that the apostate church endures. Notice also that Joshua and Caleb had to experience this time of tribulation, also. But because Joshua and Caleb had the good report based on faith, they were the only two to live through the forty years of tribulation and enter the Promised Land (salvation). When Joshua and Caleb crossed the Jordan River, it was a type for them receiving the Latter Rain of the Spirit.

Back to 1Cor 1:16 now. Truth is what sanctifies a believer. The believer is sanctified after they receive the Latter Rain and have their spiritual blindness healed. As they are fed truth by Christ at the marriage supper of the Lamb, Christ is sanctifying them.

Glorification: To be glorified is when someone else gives you glory. Here is when Christ glorified in His saints (the Elect):

2Th 1:10 When he shall come to be glorified in his saints, and to be admired in all them that believe (because our testimony among you was believed) in that day.

This event is the second coming of Christ when He comes to convert one of His Elect. After He has given the person the Latter Rain and has healed their spiritual blindness, they will see him "face to face". This is when the saints glorify Christ because they can now see Him as He is.

Now for this verse:

Rom 8:30 ...whom he justified, them he also glorified.

And this verse:

Rom 8:17 And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that

we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together.

Upon the Elect's resurrection from the grave, they will receive their glorious spiritual body and together with Christ, they will reign over the balance of unsaved mankind in the final age. As each "lost" person is converted, both Christ and the Elect will then be glorified by the newly born child of God. This is how Christ and the Elect are glorified together.

If you don't believe that Christ will save ALL mankind before He finishes is work, then you are not going to be able to receive what I stated above. We could discuss this more if you like.

You said:

Are you saying the woman in adultery was under the law, and then she wasn't?

The woman represents mankind who is under the penalty of the law because of sin (her adultery of fornicating with Satan). After the woman (each person of mankind) receives both the Early and Latter Rains of the Spirit, they will be covered by the blood of Christ and the law can no longer accuse her of sin because of Christ's sacrifice at the cross. The law is still intact but the woman is no longer guilty of violating the law - and after Christ matures her into a perfect man, full of age, she will be like Christ and will never sin again.

Another member asked me a question about the destruction of Jerusalem mentioned in Dan 9:26 and in Luke 21:20.

Sorry to jump in here so late and I have not read all the posts... but are you saying that Daniel 9:26 does not refer to the destruction of the city and the sanctuary in 70 AD? Thanks



Dear C
That is correct.

This will be difficult for you to understand. I will add my comments in blue to the scripture. Hopefully, this will make it easier for you.

Dan 9:25 Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem (this is the physical Jerusalem) unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times. 26 And AFTER threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off (die at the cross/New Covenant begins), but not for himself (for mankind): and the people (the Elect/child of God) of the prince (Christ) that shall come shall destroy the city (earthly Jerusalem) and the sanctuary (earthly temple); and the end thereof shall be with a flood (judgment that converts one of the Elect), and unto the end of the war desolations are determined (the apostasy/falling away of a babe/unconverted carnal Elect believer by the spirit of anti-Christ). 27 And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease (Old Covenant ends and New Covenant begins), and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation (time of conversion), and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.

If you understand the destruction of Jerusalem in a physical way, then the people of the Prince would be the Jews. But the Jews did not destroy Jerusalem or the temple - the Roman army did. Under the New Covenant, the Elect (as a Bride) destroys Jerusalem. This is described in Rev 19:11-20.

Here is more on how to understand Daniel's prophecy along with the end-time prophecies of the New Covenant:

The first 69 1/2 weeks of Daniel's prophecy were fulfilled in an outward and physical way under the Old Covenant. That is why the first 69 1/2 weeks were physically and literally fulfilled. This leaves 3 1/2 years of the prophecy and they are now being fulfilled spiritually under the New Covenant. They are not being fulfilled physically and literally as the first 69 1/2 weeks were.

Christ "confirmed the covenant" (the one Christ made with Abraham) when He was baptized by John the Baptist at the <u>beginning</u> of the 70th week. This left seven years for Christ to fulfill the goals of the prophecy which are outlined in Dan 9:24. In the midst of the final week, Christ was cutoff at the cross. <u>This ended the Old Covenant and began the New Covenant</u>. Daniel's prophecy must be rightly divided by this transition from the Old Covenant (physical) to the New Covenant (spiritual).

The verse below from Luke also applies to the spiritual destruction of earthly Jerusalem which occurs after Christ was cutoff. It is a spiritual event which occurs under the New Covenant.

Luke 21:20 And when ye shall see Jerusalem compassed with armies, then know that the desolation thereof is nigh.

Christ's words are "spirit" and He uses them in His spiritual teachings of the New Covenant.

In the New Covenant teachings, Jerusalem is a <u>spirit word</u> (John 6:63) which carries a different meaning than what man's wisdom teaches (1Cor 2:13).

The word "Jerusalem" which is used in Dan 9:26 and in Luke 21:20 is a <u>spirit word</u> because it is being used in Christ's end-time teachings of the New Covenant.

The end-time prophecies are describing the spiritual events (signs of the times) which happen within each Elect believer as they progress toward their conversion (the end). These spiritual events are reoccurring events and have been happening throughout this age within all the Elect.

When an Elect person is converted, the "ends of the ages" have come upon them.

1Cor 10:11 Now all these things happened to them as types, and have been written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages are come.

The Jerusalem that Christ is mentioning in Dan 9:26 and in Luke 21:20 is the <u>earthly Jerusalem that is below.</u> This is in contrast to the New Jerusalem which is above.

Earthly Jerusalem is synonymous with the spirit words "Wicked heart, Damascus, Sodom, Egypt, woman and Mystery Babylon the Great Harlot". These spirit words represent mankind's marred and carnal spirit which causes the natural man to prefer the Old Wine over the New Wine.

Luke 5:39 No man also having drunk old wine straightway desireth new: for he saith, The old is better.

The Old Wine represents the Old Covenant which is based upon a person's attempt to make themselves acceptable to God by their own works. Scripture calls this the crooked way. Mankind calls it religion. Satan's "another gospel" teaches the crooked way to apostate believers by mixing the Old Wine with the New Wine. For this reason, Satan is called the crooked serpent. When Satan deceives a "babe" with his false gospel, he spiritually kills the believer and adds another person to his apostate church. To accomplish this building of his false church, Satan (as a serpent) bites the woman (the Great Harlot/earthly Jerusalam). In other words, Satan attacks a believer through their carnal nature by feeding her his carnally pleasing lies of the Old Wine. This is how Satan eats the dust of the ground (a symbol for carnal mankind/includes babes who are carnal).

This verse applies:

Prov 23:27 For a whore (Great Harlot/earthly Jerusalem) is a deep ditch; and a strange woman is a narrow pit. 28 She also lieth in wait as for a prey, and increaseth the transgressors among men. 29 Who hath woe? who hath sorrow? who hath contentions? who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes? 30 They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine. 31 Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his color in the cup, when it moveth itself aright. 32 At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder (the spiritual killing of the saints). 33 Thine eyes shall behold strange women, and thine heart shall utter perverse things (false doctrines of the apostate church).

The New Wine (New Covenant) teaches the straight way of Christ which is to approach God strictly by faith. This faith is more than just believing that Jesus is the Christ (Christ and Him crucified). It is a faith that trusts Christ to provide all the works (both physical and spiritual) which are necessary for making oneself acceptable to God. The spiritual work that Christ does to accomplish a person's salvation/conversion is taught throughout scripture and more specifically in the end-time prophecies and in the parables that begin with the phrase "the Kingdom of Heaven is like".

When the earthly Jerusalem is surrounded by armies, its destruction is about to occur within the believer. This destruction of Jerusalem is described in Rev 18 as the destruction of the Great Harlot. After this judgment is complete, the believer will be converted.

The spiritual teachings of the New Covenant primarily teach the spiritual events that happen within the Elect as they travel the pathway to salvation. They do not teach outward, physical events that only happen one-time at the literal end of this age.
